(Isaiah 64:1-9) Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence-- (2) as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil-- to make your name known to your adversaries, and that the nations might tremble at your presence! 
Gospel Reading (Please stand)



It is all about Jesus – and it begins with him coming as the New King David.


He has an eternal kingdom in which we dwell by faith!
