

A. THE TEXT



Theme Verse: (Galatians 5:22-25)

But the fruit of the Spirit is 1. love, 2. joy, 3. peace, 4. patience, 5. kindness, 6. goodness, 7. faithfulness, 8. gentleness, 9. self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit.

THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT – 3. PEACE

(Mark 4:39) And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "**Peace!** Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.

(Mark 5:34) And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in **peace**, and be healed of your disease."

(Luke 2:14) "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth **peace** among those with whom he is pleased!"

(Luke 2:29-30) "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in **peace**, according to your word; (30) for my eyes have seen your salvation

(Luke 10:5-6) Whatever house you enter, first say, "**Peace** be to this house!" (6) And if a son of **peace** is there, your **peace** will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you.

(Luke 19:38) saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! **Peace** in heaven and glory in the highest!"

(John 14:27) **Peace** I leave with you; my **peace** I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

(John 16:33) I have said these things to you, that in me you may have **peace**. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

(John 20:19-26) On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "**Peace** be with you." (20) When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. (21) Jesus said to them again, "**Peace** be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." (22) And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. (23) If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."... (26) Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "**Peace** be with you."

(Romans 1:7) To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 5:1) Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have **peace** with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 14:17-19) For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and **peace** and joy in the Holy Spirit... (19) So then let us pursue what makes for **peace** and for mutual upbuilding.

(Romans 15:13) May the God of hope fill you with all joy and **peace** in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

(Romans 16:20) The God of **peace** will soon crush Satan under your feet. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

(1 Corinthians 1:3) Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(2 Corinthians 13:11) Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in **peace**; and the God of love and **peace** will be with you.

(Galatians 1:3) Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

(Ephesians 1:2) Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Ephesians 2:14-17) For he himself is our **peace**, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility (15) by abolishing the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making **peace**, (16) and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. (17) And he came and preached **peace** to you who were far off and **peace** to those who were near.

(Ephesians 4:3) Eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of **peace**.

(Philippians 1:2) Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Philippians 4:7) And the **peace** of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

(Colossians 1:2) To the saints and faithful brothers in Christ at Colossae: Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father.

(Colossians 1:20) And through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making **peace** by the blood of his cross.

(Colossians 3:15) And let the **peace** of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful.

(1 Thessalonians 1:1) Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and **peace**.

(1 Thessalonians 5:23) Now may the God of **peace** himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Timothy 1:2) To Timothy, my true child in the faith: Grace, mercy, and **peace** from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

(2 Timothy 2:22) So flee youthful passions and pursue righteousness, faith, love, and **peace**, along with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart.

(Philemon 1:3) Grace to you and **peace** from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Hebrews 12:14) Strive for **peace** with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.

(Hebrews 13:20-21) Now may the God of **peace** who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, (21) equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

(James 3:18) And a harvest of righteousness is sown in **peace** by those who make **peace**.

(1 Peter 1:2) According to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in the sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and for sprinkling with his blood: May grace and **peace** be multiplied to you.

(2 Peter 1:2) May grace and **peace** be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

(2 John 1:3) Grace, mercy, and **peace** will be with us, from God the Father and from Jesus Christ the Father's Son, in truth and love.

(Jude 1:2) May mercy, **peace**, and love be multiplied to you.

(Revelation 1:4) John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and **peace** from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne,

B. THE STUDY NOTES

1. Objective peace: I am "at peace" with God the Father through the blood of his Son Jesus Christ (my status).
2. Subjective peace: I have "peace in my heart" because my sins are forgiven and I have eternal life (my experience).
