A Study of the Book of Hebrews: God Speaks to Us through His Son

Lesson 3: “Our Salvation Is Made Perfect by the Suffering of Jesus”

Part 1: Heb 2:1-4, “Do Not Drift from What You Have Heard”

1. If God’s people listened to the word of God in the Old Testament delivered by angels and prophets, how should we attend to Jesus’ words?
2. How is inattentiveness to God’s Word and the road to unbelief pictured here? (verse 1)
3. How is this a warning to us?
4. We talked earlier about the Gospel being proclaimed by eyewitnesses as being the most authoritative. How does verse 3 substantiate this?
5. What did God send through Jesus and his apostles to accompany the word of salvation? (verse 4)

Part 2: Heb 2:5-13, “Christ Has Tasted Death For All Mankind”

6. As we mentioned last time, the author of the book of Hebrews differentiates often between angels and Jesus. How does he use Psalm 8 to do this?
7. How was Jesus “for a little while” lower than the angels?
8. How do we not yet see everything in subjection to Jesus?

9. How is the glory and honor of Jesus tied in with his suffering of death?

10. How does verse 9 teach “substitutionary atonement”?

11. How are we considered brothers and sisters of Christ? (See also Matt 12:46-50)

Part 3: Heb 2:14-18, “We Share in Christ’s Flesh and Blood”

12. How has death and the one who has the power of death been defeated for us?

13. Do the angels help in our salvation? (verse 16)

14. Why did Jesus need to be made like us?

15. What comfort does verse 18 give us when we are greatly tempted or tested?
