Lesson 12: "The Post-flood Promises" Genesis 9:1-17

Part 1: Genesis 9:1-7, "What has changed since the flood?"

1. What are the first words of God's blessing for Noah and his sons?
2. Where have we seen these before? (Hint: Gen 1:28; 8:17)
3. Think back to the reason for the flood (Gen 6:1-5). Why then would God want to encourage marriage and the bearing of children?
4. What then has *not* changed since the flood?
5. What, on the other hand, *has* changed?
6. Where does this fear stem from (v 3)?
7. God allows all animals for food here, but restricts it in the Levitical law. How can we say that now all animals are given for food? (See also Acts 11:1-10.)
8. What is the only stipulation (v 4)? (See also Acts 15:20)
9. According to Lev. 17:11-12, why does God forbid the eating of blood?
10. How is man's blood different?
