11. What does this say about the place of women in the church?

12. What are some commendations that Paul makes to the people whom he is greeting?

13. What is the church to do with those who teach another doctrine and so cause division?

14. What does it mean “serve their own appetites”? (18)

15. How will their doctrines sound to the people? (18)

16. Who was Paul’s stenographer?

17. What comforting and final credit does the Apostle give to God? (25-27)
